Academy priority 1: Exceptional Student offer

Leaders focus on pupils. They develop a curriculum that is ambitious and designed to give all pupils, particularly disadvantaged pupils and including pupils with SEND, the currency of knowledge, strength in character and the cultural capital they need to succeed in life.

Academy Aims;

- 1. Student leadership is embedded throughout all year groups at Walton through our Character education
- 2. Students develop into responsible citizens
- 3. Students expand their knowledge and understanding of responsibility and leadership.
- 4. Students enhance their communication and interpersonal skills

5. Students are more engaged with faculties and articulately promote Walton both within the academy, with visitors and to the wider community

Academy Actions;

- 1. Foster a culture of leadership involving students at all Academy events
- 2. Students Leadership spreadsheet developed in partnership with faculties
- 3. Clear job descriptions are developed for each leadership role to provide clarity to students and staff
- 4. Ensure regular opportunities for student voice are included in QA calendar and through regular student council meetings/feedback
- 5. Student voice is used to identify where new leadership roles are needed to support the Walton student community.
