VISION, VALUES AND ETHOS




At Walton, we have high standards, and these are matched by equally high expectations in terms of student behaviour and attitude. All students are expected to adhere to the Walton 3Rs.

In years 7 to 9, students follow core studies in English, maths and science, and a rich and varied curriculum that includes religious education, drama, dance and music, as well as visual arts and modern languages.

In year 10, students then specialise in four subjects in addition to their core studies, following a wide range of inspiring courses such as triple science, dance, drama, humanities, religious studies, as well as health and social care and food and nutrition. We ensure that students are able to follow a variety of courses, including access to the English Baccalaureate (EBacc).




When they start, students will join a tutor group where they will develop supportive relationships with their peers and tutor. Each year group is led by a head of year and has a dedicated pastoral mentor and a tutor team, enabling students to quickly access a support network of staff who are familiar to them throughout their time at the academy.

Based on their tutor group, students will belong to one of four houses - Belton, Belvoir, Burghley and Irnham. Healthy competition, leadership skills and teamworking skills are nurtured through the house system, with each house taking part in regular competitions.

All students follow our LORIC curriculum - leadership, organisation, resilience, initiative and communication. These skills are intended to support students' academic learning whilst also preparing them for the next stages in their educational journey and the world of work.

We are proactive in ensuring all students engage with a comprehensive programme of careers education, information, advice and guidance (CEIAG). Importantly, this meets and exceeds Department for Education (DfE) professional standards of practice, is catered to individual students and is impartial. It is based on a partnership with students and their parents or carers, and starts right from year 7 and continues into sixth form.

Transition programme

We understand that transitioning to secondary school is a significant milestone both for students and for parents. Which is why we are committed to going above and beyond to help every student settle comfortably and confidently into life at Walton Academy. From personalised support to a welcoming environment, we prioritise each student's well-being and academic success.

To ensure a smooth and successful transition, we offer a comprehensive programme designed to support students academically and emotionally as they prepare for year 7 and beyond.

Our transition programme includes:

- In-person visits to all feeder primary schools by our leadership team.
- A comprehensive three-day transition programme designed to familiarise students with our school environment.
- Strong links with local primary schools to facilitate a seamless transition process.
- Additional visits by our SEND (special educational needs and disabilities) team to primary schools to address specific needs.
